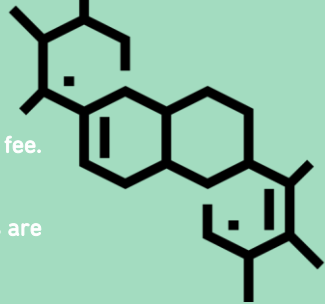


REACH REGISTRATION COSTFACTORS GUIDE

When registering a chemical substance under REACH several costs influence the final registration fee. Understanding these can help you plan and budget effectively.

Each registration is unique; there is no one-size-fits-all formula nor public database where these fees are tabulated and can be easily accessed.



1. MANDATORY CHARACTERIZATION LAB TESTING



Before you can register, **sameness testing** is required to confirm if your actual substance matches the substance identity you are reporting. This includes **analytical tests or other lab work to demonstrate chemical equivalence**.

The costs of these tests can vary considerably depending on the chemical nature of the substance, the analytical techniques required, etc.

2. INFORMATION REQUIREMENTS



A REACH registration involves submitting a **technical dossier** and, sometimes, a **chemical safety report**. The **standard information requirements** are a very specific set of information about the substance that need to be submitted to the European Chemicals Agency (ECHA). This information is mainly focused on **physico-chemical, toxicological and ecotoxicological endpoints**.

Costs vary widely depending on the substance and data available. Registrants of the same substance have to share information, reason why the costs can be significantly reduced:

- If **the substance is already registered** by other companies, **you will need a LoA** to the information requirements from the current registrants to legally use their data.
- **Otherwise, you will need to generate this data by yourself** using in silico, in vitro or in vivo testing strategies suitable to the substance.

3. OFFICIAL ECHA FEES



ECHA will charge fees to the new registrant to evaluate and eventually approve or reject their registration application.

Those fees depend on the tonnage band (the volume you manufacture/import per year) and the company size (micro, small, medium, large) of the registrant company, and they can be consulted [here](#).

4. CONSULTANT FEES
